Standard of Practice

The ASHI Standard of Practice was an essential tool in defining home inspection as a recognized profession and gaining traction within the real estate market. Refined over the years, the Standard remains an influential document across the industry, and ASHI Members continue to adhere to it today.

The document is divided into specific home systems and details how home inspectors should inspect each component. The ASHI Standard of Practice helps guide the inspector during the home inspection and ensures the client receives a thorough and effective inspection. ASHI encourages everyone involved with the home buying process to review the Standard of Practice to understand the home inspector's role in the process.

Code of Ethics

Integrity, honesty, and objectivity are fundamental principles embodied by this code, which sets forth obligations of ethical conduct for the home inspection profession. ASHI Membership has adopted this code to provide high ethical standards to safeguard the public and the profession.

Inspectors shall comply with this code, shall avoid association with any enterprise whose practices violate this Code, and shall strive to uphold, maintain, and improve the integrity, reputation, and practice of the home inspection profession.

The CRC also assists staff with chapter compliance issues and is critical in planning ASHI's annual leadership development conference. Education Committee This is the committee for those who are lifelong learners and passionate about supporting and creating educational opportunities.


Legislation Committee This committee will empower chapters and members to push bills across the country, ensuring that the members are informed and have the power to influence legislation.

How to Level Up

An overview of the levels of ASHI Membership

Il home inspectors joining ASHI, regardless of experience, begin at the Associate Member level. Members can move up to higher levels at their own pace. Here we outline the requirements and benefits of each level of membership.

ASHI ASSOCIATE MEMBER

This level is the starting point of ASHI Membership.

Requirements:

1 Submit a membership application online.



- Pass the ASHI Standard of
 Practice and Code of Ethics
 education modules.
- After one full year at this level, Associate members must begin earning 20 ASHI-approved CE annually.

Benefits:

ASHI Associate Member logo use via Accredible.

ASHI INSPECTOR

The next level on the ASHI membership path is the ASHI Inspector, intended for members who have increased their experience as a practicing home inspector and have refined their technical knowledge.

Requirements:

- 1 2 3 from Associate Membership requirements.
- Obtain, maintain, and provide proof of home inspector license as required by the member's home state. If the home state does *not* require licensing, the member must provide proof of passing the National Home Inspector Examination (NHIE).

- 5 Obtain 20 ASHI-approved CE annually.
- Submit valid proof of completion of at least 50 fee-paid home inspections that meet or exceed ASHI's Standard of Practice.
- 7 Receive an affidavit from ASHI, notarized with the total number of inspections completed.
- Pass the Report Verification process. Using ASHI's report verification portal, members will submit five full-home inspection reports for review. The report verifiers will review the reports in accordance with the ASHI Standard of Practice and Code of Ethics.

ASHI CERTIFIED INSPECTOR (ACI)

The highest level of ASHI membership is the ASHI Certified Inspector (ACI). The ACI credential is fully accredited by the National Commission of Certifying Agencies (NCCA). ACIs are recognized as having the highest standards in the profession. Once



this level is reached, members have access to all ASHI member benefits. ACIs are recognized as leaders in the home inspection industry.

NOTE: It is a requirement of all membership levels to remain current on dues and payments to ASHI.



Getting Involved

Why chapters matter

have been a proud member of ASHI since 2014. The first thing I did when I joined ASHI was to also join the St. Louis Chapter of ASHI and start attending meetings. I joined to be listed on their website and for the local education and PR opportunities, camaraderie, and the built-in support network.

Like many chapters, the St. Louis chapter meets monthly and hosts regular speakers and roundtable discussions. I first got involved primarily to join the education committee. I had previously been involved in educating others in volunteer programs and was a contractor for many years, so I thought it was a good fit. I was soon chair of that committee. By getting involved, I could help improve the quality of my chapter's monthly education, resulting in change for the better.

I had also observed that we had a hard time getting members who hadn't been involved in leadership roles to volunteer, even though St. Louis ASHI is a strong chapter. The group needed younger members to participate. Like many, the chapter was facing a problem with volunteerism. Some chapters have a round-robin of the same leaders year after year, rotating roles. I ask my fellow inspectors: Why not be a part of the solution and get involved?

Why to Volunteer

This problem is not unique to ASHI. Many other associations with chapters have the same problem. Getting involved is important. When you get involved, you have a voice, an opinion, are heard, and effect change.

Whether you're a long-time member or newer, you can offer a fresh perspective and new ideas. Without ideas and volunteers, things never change or improve. We must move forward as our industry and the industries impacting ours evolve. This is why I got involved at the national level.

While I hope you get involved for the betterment of the society and to protect our profession, some will choose to get involved because it helps their business, and that's OK, too. Being involved is a great marketing tool. I told everyone about my involvement and used it as an opportunity to promote ASHI. At the same time, I was indirectly promoting myself. My involvement gave me a lot of credentials that helped open doors that may otherwise not have opened. When potential referral sources and clients found out I was respected enough to be elected to serve in a leadership role by my peers, it paid off organically.

Getting More Involved

Chapter leaders should consider asking members to join micro-projects; after they've been involved in smaller, short-term projects, consider asking them to serve on a committee. Think of the committees as a funnel of future leaders that will fill officer and director positions on the chapter board.

The national board and committees consider the chapters as their pipeline to fill ASHI National positions. We also look to the membership at-large to populate committees, so you don't need to be a chapter member to get involved at the national level.

You can make a difference in many ways. You can form your own ASHI meeting group, start a new chapter, or join an existing chapter. You can serve on a committee or task force and become a leader at the chapter or national level or mentor others. Getting involved helps you understand the industry's evolving landscape.

Understanding Certification

What is ASHI Certification?

he ASHI Certified Inspector (ACI) credential is a distinguished designation awarded by the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI) to professionals who meet rigorous standards of competence, experience, and ethics.

In 2009, the National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA) accredited this credential, ensuring it meets high national standards for certification programs. ASHI has successfully renewed this credential with NCCA three times now, a five-year renewal, and it is valid until 2029.

Home inspectors who earn the ACI credential benefit from increased credibility, trust from clients, and recognition from real estate professionals. The NCCA accreditation adds further value, confirming that ASHI Certified Inspectors are held to the highest level of industry excellence. This designation can lead to more

business opportunities, higher pay, and professional growth in a competitive field.

To earn the ACI credential, candidates must meet several stringent requirements.

These include passing the National Home Inspector Examination (NHIE), completing a minimum of 250 fee-paid home inspections that comply with ASHI's Standard of Practice, and submitting reports for review and verification.
Additionally, applicants must adhere to ASHI's
Code of Ethics and agree to ongoing professional
development by earning 20 ASHI Continuing
Education Credits on a yearly basis.

Why is the ACI credential accredited by NCCA?

Accreditation by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA) ensures the certification program adheres

to national standards for competency, fairness, and rigor, providing greater credibility to

This session shows you what components to inspect, how to identify deficiencies, how to report your findings, and how to manage

client expectations.


ASHI Standard Swimming Pool and Spa Inspections: Ready to dive into po inspections? These of be a significant addition
